NEWS FROM THE PROJECT

We are moving forward with an important set of activities to finalize the FWF-PEEK project Conviviality as Potentiality: From Amnesia and Pandemic towards a Convivial Epistemology (AR 679, 2021-25). This newsletter is the penultimate in a series of newsletters, developed over the arts-based research years. The project will officially end on January 31, 2025.

In the final eight months, we return to our home country of Austria and focus on assessing the state of conviviality for all citizens. This includes advocating for equality and rights in participation in NGOs and grassroots movements and ensuring government support through grants, which is essential to the principles of democracy in the EU. We also reflect on the experiences and lives of people who are not citizens and are struggling through the Austrian asylum process—people who seek refugee status, have to wait years for legal papers and live in fear of deportation. These people are often immobile, trapped in a limbo of uncertainty.

Additionally, we look at the principle of such a utopian term as conviviality in relation to the wars in the present moment, Russia-Ukraine, and the wars in the Middle East. These dramatic geopolitical events are reflected in our reflections and influence our engagement in Austria.

Since our last newsletter, we have also documented ongoing developments and the

intensity of our work in this newsletter. We are looking at ways to improve community research by introducing two key roles in the community: Reflection, Doing, Living and transition structures of empowerment with reflection on LGBTQI+ positions, steady endorsement of anti-racist politics, a critique of antisemitism, asking for a decolonial politics of the contemporary neoliberal global capitalist societies.

Finally, we would like to thank the Rector Dr. Johan F. Hartle and the Vice-Rector Mag. Dr. Ingeborg Erhart (Art and Teaching), and Vice-Rector Mag. Werner Skvara (Infrastructure and Sustainability). We are also very grateful for the cooperation with the heads of the three departments and their teams at the Academy of Fine Arts Vienna, Mag. Michaela Glanz (Art | Research | Support), BA EMBA Mag. Angelina Kratschanova (International Office), and Mag. Dr. Ingrid Schacherl (Coordination Office for Advancement of Women | Gender Studies | Diversity).

We are delighted to share the wonderful news that our colleague, Dr. Sophie Uitz, has welcomed a new addition to their family! Please join us in sending warm congratulations and best wishes as they embark on this exciting new chapter of parenthood!

Finally, we would like to express our appreciation to the artists, NGOs, professors, scholars, speakers, and friends as well as the institutions around the world who have stood by us on this journey so far.

Lamia Joreige is a visual artist and filmmaker who lives and works in Beirut. She earned her BFA from the Rhode Island School of Design, where she studied painting and film-making. She uses archival documents and elements of fiction to reflect on history and its possible narration, and on the relationship between individual stories and collective memory. Her practice, rooted in her country's experience, explores the possibilities of representing the Lebanese wars and their aftermath, particularly in Beirut, a city at the center of her imagery. Her work is essentially on time, the recordings of its trace, and its effects on us.
